Written Summary

Outhuildings/Features

Alexander Transou was a local farmer, storekeeper, and woodworker whose store stood southeast of his home. The Worths remodeled the house in 1962, retaining original paneled doors, flush board sheathing, and simple mantels. Brick nogging insulates the dwelling. Notable outbuildings include the 1848 Jonathan Transou House and the 1870s Amos Transou House, which was moved to this location in the 1920s (Gwynne Taylor; Langdon Oppermann, Winston-Salem Northern Beltway report, 1991, p. 81).

This two-story side-gable-roofed house has been significantly altered since 1991 by the application of vinyl siding, replacement of original windows, and replacement of the 1870s rear ell with a larger gabled ell, screened porch, and deck. The house retains two front doors, chamfered porch posts spanned by a wood railing, and brick end chimneys. The interior condition is unknown (HF).
