**Written Summary**

No historic building at this location; vacant lot (HF).

Clarence E. Fulk's "Memories and Comments at the Age of Ninety-Five," written in 1976, includes a photograph of the three-story, front-gable-roofed, weatherboarded building, which had a hip-roofed front porch and four-over-four sash windows. Fulk states that the building included a heavy machinery repair shop on the first floor, a grist meal on the second floor, and a social hall, Labor Exchange office, and storage on the third floor (HF).

The 1979 survey file indicates that this building was demolished in the 1930s but the brick foundation was still extant. The Pfafftown Historic District boundary description in the Winston-Salem Northern Beltway Report (Western Section) prepared by Langdon Oppermann in October 1991 does not mention this property (HF).
