Written Summary

Anna Pfaff and Louise Pfaff Douthit inherited this house, which also served as the local telephone office. Interior features include Greek Revival-style mantels and two-panel doors, a central stair with a heavy turned newel post, and plaster walls (Gwynne Taylor; Langdon Oppermann, Winston-Salem Northern Beltway report, 1991, p. 82).

This two-story, three-bay, side-gable-roofed house is executed in four-to-one common bond brick with penciled mortar joints. The double-leaf front door has a two-part, opaque-glass, arched transom beneath a brick segmental arch. A terrace with short brick piers spanned by a decorative iron railing extends across the façade. The house has six-over-six sash windows, brick end chimneys, and a large two-story frame addition that has been constructed on the main block's rear elevation and over the one-story brick rear ell. A tall frame shed-roofed carport projects from the rear elevation (HF).
