## Written Summary

Monroe and Eliza Ziglar Conrad were the original owners of this house. Subsequent owners included Amos Oscar Conrad, his daughters Kate Conrad Bailey and Caroline Conrad Stroble, the Styrons, and John B. Fox. Interior features such as beaded wainscoting, mantels with applied sawnwork, five-panel doors, and a central stair with a heavy turned newel post were intact in 1979. The one-story gabled addition on the south end was constructed in 1951; the one-story addition on the north end in 1979 (Gwynne Taylor).

This weatherboarded I-house has a hip-roofed front porch supported by bracketed turned posts spanned by a turned balustrade, original two-over-two sash windows, a double-leaf paneled front door framed by sidelights and a transom, boxed cornices with gable end returns, eave brackets with pendants, diamond-shaped attic vents, and two brick interior chimneys (HF).
