Written Summary

This one-and-one-half-story, weatherboarded, L-shaped house has a shed-roofed front porch supported by bracketed turned posts spanned by a wood railing; a large shed dormer with exposed eave brackets on the front roof slope; replacement windows; deep cornice returns; and stuccoed brick interior chimneys (HF).

The following historical background information is from Langdon Oppermann's Winston-Salem Northern Beltway survey report (1991).

This house was constructed for Will Wilson, probably in the late nineteenth century, and altered in the 1910s or 1920s. Will and his brother George started the Wilson Brothers Lumber Company in Rural Hall (now Brannock & Lynch Lumber Co.). Subsequent owners include Peyton Abbott, minister of Pfafftown Christian Church, and Sol Stimpson, who bought the house ca. 1912 and lived there until his death in the late 1970s.
