Written Summary

This house is within the boundaries of the Pfafftown Historic District, which was determined eligible for the National Register after survey for a NCDOT project. The house was not included in the proposed district inventory. Attempts to contact the current owners, James and Jill Brown, were unsuccessful.

This two-story, frame, L-plan house has a wraparound porch supported by turned posts; original two-over-two sash windows; gabled wall dormers; a one-story gabled rear wing with a shed room on the south elevation; a screened rear porch section; brick interior chimneys; and a rear deck (HF).
